Southern Connecticut's Steve Armstrong Named Most Valuable Player

- Bryant's Granatell Selected Offensive Player of the Year; Bentley's Tetzl Named Defensive Player of the Year, Bernadeau Earns Offensive Lineman of the Year, Miller Received Defensive Lineman of the Year; American International's Parent and Assumption's Woodard Share Freshman of the Year Honors; Bryant's Fine Named Coach of the Year -

South Easton, Mass. – Southern Connecticut State University junior quarterback **Steve Armstrong (Nutley, N.J.)** has been named the 2007 Northeast-10 Football Most Valuable Player as voted by the conference's 10 coaches.

Armstrong helped lead the Owls to their third straight NCAA appearance this season. He currently ranks first in the NE-10 in total offense (2,845), pass efficiency (173.4), touchdowns (28) and passing yards (2850) and completion percentage (67.3%/ 198-294). In addition, Armstrong was named to the All Northeast-10 First-Team for the second straight year.

Bryant University senior quarterback **Charlie Granatell (Franklin Lakes, N.J.)** was selected the 2007 Northeast-10 Offensive Player of the Year. Granatell helped lead the Bulldogs to the Northeast-10 Regular Season Title and a trip to the NCAA Championships. He currently ranks among the league leaders in touchdowns (13), completion percentage (60.9%/148-243) and passing yards (1789). In addition, Granatell was named to the All Northeast-10 Second-Team for the second straight season.

Bentley College senior defensive back **Paul Tetzl (Millbury, Mass.)** has been named the 2007 Northeast-10 Defensive Player of the Year. Tetzl ranks 20th overall in the conference in total tackles (68) and is ranked first in interceptions with seven. In addition, he has returned 21 kickoffs for 607 yards and one touchdown. A three-time All Northeast-10 selection, Tetzl was named to the First-Team for the first time in his collegiate career.

Tetzl's teammate **Mackenzey Bernadeau (Waltham, Mass.)** has been selected as the 2007 Northeast-10 Offensive Lineman of the Year for the second straight season. The senior guard has helped the Bentley offense rush for 114.7 yards per game and as a team surrendered 33 sacks. Bernadeau has been selected to the Northeast-10 First-Team for the third straight season.

Bentley senior defensive lineman **Scott Miller (Reading, Mass.)** also received a major award as he was named the 2007 Defensive Lineman of the Year. Miller ranks 26th overall in the conference for total tackles (62), second in sacks (8.5), forced fumbles (3), fumbles recovered (4) and is third in tackles for a loss (15). In addition, he was named to the All Northeast-10 First-Team.

American International quarterback **Rob Parent (West Warwick, R.I.)** and Assumption College running back **Herb Woodard (Salem, N.J.)** were named the 2007 Northeast-10 Co-Freshmen of the Year. Parent

finished the year ranked sixth in the conference in passing yards (1,992) and tied for fourth overall in touchdowns with 13. He also completed 54.2 percent of his passes (128-236) and threw only eight interceptions. Woodard finished the year with 966 yards rushing which is currently second-best in the conference. He averaged 5.4 yards per carry and scored 10 touchdowns.

Bryant's **Marty Fine** was named the 2007 Northeast-10 Coach of the Year after leading the Bulldogs to their second straight Northeast-10 Regular Season Title. In 2006, Bryant earned a four-way share of the regular season title. Bryant is currently 8-2 overall and will travel to Southern Connecticut on Saturday for a NCAA Championship First Round matchup.
